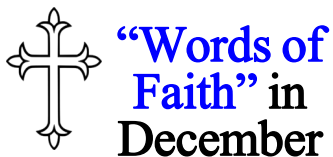

From the Desk of Pastor Dan CHRISTMAS 2024 AND ALWAYS!



Last Sunday afternoon (November 17), Cathy and I shared an unexpected joy watching The Best Christmas Pageant Ever at the King Ranger. That Christmas Pageant taught a shocked church community the true meaning of Christmas! It took me back to when as a 10-year-old, my parents took me and my younger sister to church on Christmas Eve where we yawned, fidgeted and teased each other in the second pew from the front.

Why did they take us to church that night? Because, like the Wise Men, they were called and guided by a star. The Word of God, Jesus Christ, conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary as the angel told the shepherds, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord!"

We walk again with Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem, also bearing heavy loads, yet trusting God's promise that something great is going to happen: God in Christ will be born among us no matter what to save us from our sins and give us heaven forever. Prophets foretold it, the angels have spoken. We move through life, swept up in our plans and schedules, but God still breaks into our lives with grace, mercy and peace. While they were there, the time came for Mary gave birth to her firstborn son, wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger because there was no place for them in the Inn. In this newborn's cry, we meet God who enters our broken lives as one of us.

We sit with the shepherds on the night shift; in the dark outside city limits, away from warm fires and lamplight. Suddenly a bright light jolts us awake, an angel speaks; then a multitude of the heavenly host sings of glory to God and peace for all. Why would the angels come to a band of poor, lowly shepherds? God meets them and us on our own turf and it makes all the difference for the world. "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." Faith comes in the experience of encountering Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. Those outcast shepherds are the first to meet the hope of the world, Jesus, God with us, who loves and forgives everyone and wants all people to be saved!

We peer out the back window of the inn at the growing commotion by the stable. Through the dark, shadowy figures gather at the stable. We meet God who makes room for us, even after being turned away, even when there seems to be no place for him in the busy world. Even so, Jesus comes to us, makes a place in this world and draws all people in. God meets us here in the marvel and mystery of this night, transforming ordinary expectations and human failings into extraordinary faith. Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds return to their flocks and their families, forever changed. Now they go and make known what's been told them about Jesus. The Word of God, our manger. The church, our stable. The world, our mission field. Jesus Christ, our newborn King, Lord of lords and Savior, is with us now with his grace, mercy and peace. Come, let us adore Him!

Holy Communion will be celebrated at each service. Please join us to offer praise and worship to our Living God for the gift of love he has given us in Jesus Christ.



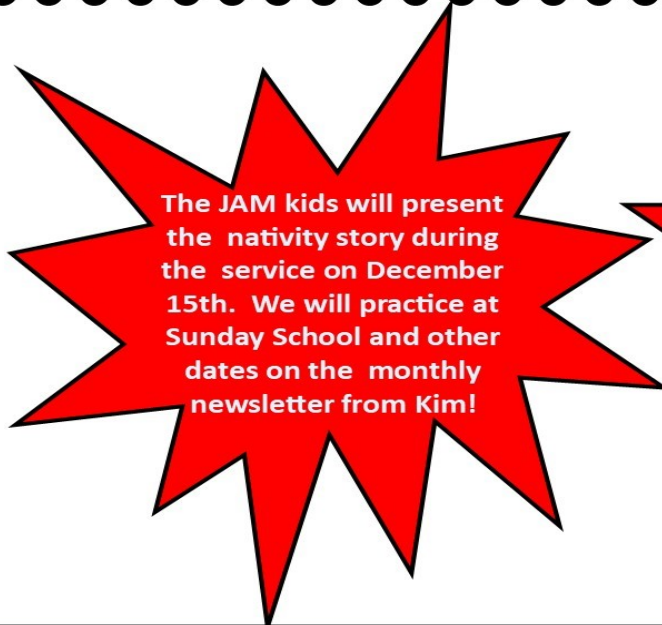
Faith Lutheran Youth

Cheering on a Comeback

Like most sports fans, I love a good comeback! There's nothing quite like when a team mounts a comeback after falling hopelessly behind. It is thrilling to experience how the players, coaches, and fans rally to support one another and celebrate each step along the way just to get back into a position to potentially be victorious!

Recently, my wife and I came back: After a six-month absence from the church we attend when in town, we were finally able to come back to worship on a Sunday morning this month. Life and ministry commitments had us on the road since Easter and we truly missed the church that had become family to us. But the comeback we experienced was not personally thrilling for me. Instead, I sheepishly walked through those doors, wondering what people were thinking of us after all this time. I even found myself saying "the prodigals have returned" to one of my friends.

As I began to process it, my experience really bothered me. Why did I feel this way? No one was judgmental at all. Not one person asked, "where have you been?" Many greeted us with joyous expressions of welcome. So why did I, a minister of the Gospel who should definitely know better, feel such guilt and shame? And if I had this intense struggle, for how many others might similar feelings be an obstacle to coming back to church? As we approach Advent and Christmas, we are more likely to encounter people who may not be in the pattern of attending church regularly. Many may be struggling with intense feelings of guilt and shame even thinking about returning to worship. Some of these feelings may get projected onto other church members, like my thinking we would be judged or looked down on. Other feelings might be more of an internal spiritual battle.

Regardless, it is mission-critical for the church to cheer on the comeback.

If you haven't been active in church lately, I want my experience to be an encouragement for you. While the devil will use every trick he can to keep you away from the life-giving experience of a faith community gathered around word and sacrament, trust that God desires your presence and participation. I am confident that you will encounter a loving, welcoming reception by your church family who will celebrate your presence.

If you are a regular worshipper, please enthusiastically support and encourage any and all comebacks! Begin to pray daily for the Holy Spirit to gather those whom the Lord calls to come back to worship. Pray for God to bring to mind specific people to pray for and encourage. Perhaps God is leading you to reach out to someone. Be mindful to not inadvertently contribute to any feelings of guilt or shame. Instead, take an interest in them out of genuine love. Offer to meet for coffee or lunch. Find out what's going on in their lives and how you can pray for them. Consider inviting them to a special event, small group, or service project that gives the opportunity for casual, relational connection. And most importantly, when you see someone new or that you haven't seen for some time, warmly welcome them and simply let them know you are so happy to see them. These simple actions can make a difference as we cheer on a comeback!
