## From the Desk of : Pastor Dan Cave



November is here, inviting us into the church observances of All Saints Sunday, Thanksgiving and Christ the King Sunday, the end of the church year and the anticipation of the season of Advent in December. Considering all that is going on in the world, our nation and our own lives, people are experiencing real grief from many experiences. So here is some helpful borrowed advice.

### Absolutely Never Say This to People Experiencing Terrible Times A Short List (top 5) from Dr. Kate Bowler

"Well at least . . . " Don't compare or minimize another's grief. Let them feel what they feel for as long as they feel it.

"In my long life, I've learned that . . . " Ease up on life lessons when people are facing the potential end of theirs. Life is a privilege not a reward.

"It's going to get better. I promise." Don't promise something you can't deliver.

"God needed an angel." This makes God look needy and is contradictory to biblical tradition that says angels are made from scratch not from deceased people. God does not take people from us. God comforts and grieves with us in our sorrow and welcomes people home when their physical bodies can no longer sustain them.

"Everything happens for a reason." When someone is drowning, the only thing worse than failing to throw them a life preserver is handing them a reason. Though you may believe and draw comfort from these words, they can be harmful when said to others even leading to self-blame, because it leaves people wondering and guessing at what that reason could be and what they possibly did wrong.

### Give This a Go, See How it Works: A Short List from Dr. Kate Bowler

"I'd love to bring you a meal this week. Can I email/call you about it?" When experiencing cancer or other illnesses or the debilitating effects of grief, presents can be helpful. Food, plants, magazines, etc. It doesn't matter, because people often have a hard time naming what they need but the sentiment is what matters most.

"You are a beautiful person." Tell your friend something about his or her life that you admire without making it feel like a eulogy. Everyone needs those words of encouragement.

"I am so grateful to hear about how you're doing and just know that I'm on your team." Don't be nosy and ask people for details about their condition. Just let them know you are there cheering for them and a willing listener if they ever feel like they want to share.

"Can I give you a hug?" People who are suffering often feel isolated. A hug or a hand on the arm can mean so much, but always ask first.

"Oh, my friend, that sounds hard." Be willing to stare down the ugliness and sadness with those who are facing it. Just let them talk about it if that's what they want to do.

\*\*\*\*\*Silence\*\*\*\*\* Pain and tragedy are awkward. There is never one perfect thing to say. Sometimes the best thing to do is just "show up and shut up."

Have a blessed All Saints Day; Happy Thanksgiving and to Christ our King and Healer be all glory and praise!

## Mission Moment

## All Hands on Deck: Training Church Leaders

I recently returned from LCMC's Annual Gathering in Missouri. It was a great Gathering, as always. This year's theme was "All Hands on Deck" and reflected our present need for the whole church to offer ourselves, and all our gifts and abilities, to Christ and his Kingdom-building ministry in the world. Our association (along with many other denominations) is facing a leadership crisis. As pastors retire or leave full-time vocational ministry, not enough new people are entering to keep pace. Simply put, we no longer have enough active pastors for established congregations, never mind planting new ones!

The reality is that the old models that previously sustained leadership development for the American church for over a century have been in trouble for a generation or more. While some sounded the alarm 25 years ago, it has only been in the past few years that the issue has become front and center. At this year's Gathering, our association had the courage to address this directly. Hundreds of pastors and other congregational representatives met in focus groups to share ideas, listen to concerns, and pray for God to raise up future leaders to lead our congregations in mission for Christ.

One idea to address our leadership challenge is to help equip church members to step-up to greater leadership roles and responsibilities in specific ministry areas. More congregations are looking beyond traditional models of a full-time professional pastor towards developing teams of ministry specialists (part-time paid staff or volunteer) to share the load. These specialists may already be church members who can be trained and equipped to be a care minister, youth minister, children's minister, Bible study leader, worship leader, church administrator, volunteer coordinator, or even the Sunday morning preacher. These part-time ministers may be retired or have other full or part-time work to sustain them.

Here's the good news: We now have a pathway for better equipping anyone whom God may be calling to step into a greater leadership role in the church! Harvest Workers recently launched a new CHURCH LEADER TRACK that is specifically designed for equipping leaders for specialized ministry roles. Students receive essential ministry training in biblical studies, theological foundations, leadership, discipleship and one area of specialized ministry to which he or she feels called.

Similar to our Pastoral Ministry Essentials Track, the Church Leader Track is fully online and on-demand, making it both very flexible to accommodate any schedule as well as affordable. The Church Leader Track can be completed in just 12 months and costs \$165 a month. If you or someone you know is sensing God's nudge to greater leadership in ministry, check-out [www.harvestworkers.net](http://www.harvestworkers.net) to learn more about the Church Leader Track. There's no doubt in my mind that the challenges we face today indeed call for all hands on deck!
