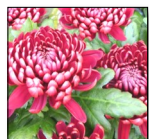

From the Desk of Andrew Cave “We Have a Responsibility”

Bible Verses:

Matthew 18: 5-6 - “Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me. If anyone causes one of these little ones—those who believe in me—to stumble, it would be better for them to have a large millstone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea.”

Matthew 18: 14 - “It is not the will of your Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish.”

These Bible verses reveal to us that there is a special place in God’s heart for children. Jesus’ disciples are arguing about who would be the greatest, and Jesus states that the greatest in the kingdom of heaven will be those who are as humble as a child. He says that anyone who welcomes a child in His Name, welcomes Him. Jesus is clear that we must not cause a little one to sin or lead them astray. In fact, it would be better for us to be at the bottom of the sea than to mislead a child. In verse 14 of this text, Jesus tells his disciples that God’s will is for all children to be saved.

What is important to God needs to be important to us. Where God’s heart is, our heart needs to be. As parents, we have a responsibility. As grandparents, we have a responsibility. As the Church, we have a responsibility. As disciples, we have a responsibility. Our responsibility is to lead children to the truth, whose name is Jesus Christ. We are to teach them the ways of God and show them the love of God! If we do not teach children to love Jesus, the world will teach them how not to. If you come in contact with children in your neighborhood who need Christ, steer them toward Him by your example, your words, and your acts of kindness. When you show God’s love to a child, you are not simply blessing that child, you are glorifying your father in heaven.

Prayer:

Dear God, may we be a congregation that continues to invest in the faith of children. Thank you for blessing our congregation with people who care deeply for children. Guide us as we teach them your ways. Help us as we strive to set a Christian example for them. Help us to walk with the humility of a child. May we look more like you Jesus every day! AMEN

Lord, Open Our Eyes!

Have you ever found yourself reading a familiar Bible story when suddenly you are struck with a revelation? Isn't it a joy to read and receive Good News in fresh ways?!?

Recently I was reading Matthew 20 and read once again the story of Jesus healing two blind men along the road outside of Jericho. Jesus performed so many miracles and healings that we are prone to sometimes gloss over them and miss the magnitude of what is happening. Compared to his many other miracles, this one can seem mundane.

In this particular story, the two blind men had heard that Jesus was going to be passing by on the road. So, they began crying out to Jesus: "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" While the crowds sought to shush them, the blind men were persistent in their cries. Hearing their persistence, Jesus calls out to the blind men, "What do you want me to do?" The men replied "Lord, open our eyes." Jesus healed their sight and immediately they followed Jesus.

I wonder how much spiritual blindness we suffer from and simply have not had the faith, wisdom, or courage to cry out with any persistence "Lord, have mercy" to our miracle-working, sight-giving Lord. All too often we endure a less than abundant, faith-filled life, unable to see God and his activity in the world in order to both delight and participate in it.

All around our District I meet devoted church members and leaders who earnestly desire the church to be healthy, strong, and often return to a day of former vitality. Yet I am convinced more than ever that the journey of following Jesus includes the courage of blind men and women crying out to Jesus, "Lord, have mercy on us!" And when the pressures from within the church and out in the world both conspire to silence the faithful pleas for mercy, we are called to persist with an expectant, hopeful faith.

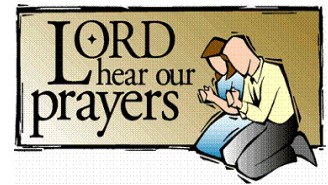
I believe that Jesus will hear the cries of the faithful. When he asks, "What do you want me to do?" I pray that we can have the simple and pure faith to ask for vision: "Lord, open our eyes." Open our eyes to see you for who you are... to see ourselves for who we are... to see your kingdom... to see our neighbors... to see the least, and the lost, and the left out. Jesus is faithful and will answer that prayer and give new vision.

Just imagine the life-giving renewal that Jesus could usher in through humble, honest, and faithful congregations following Jesus into their future with clarity of vision and purpose!

Our five-day three-year-old class was walking down the hall, but Bowen stopped to take a selfie with Mrs. O (matching shirts).

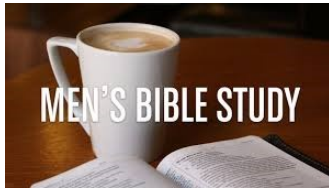


Evelyn finds the slide that fits just right for her.

These quilts are just beautiful, and they took a lot of time to make. If you see a particular quilt that you would like to purchase, please speak to Doris Engelhardt. The Quilting Ladies are willing to sell a few of them for a charitable donation. Funds will be used to buy any needed quilting or shipping supplies.

You will also be given an envelope at the church picnic or as you enter the Sanctuary the morning of the Thankoffering Service. We invite all women and men to participate in our annual Thankoffering Service (on October 22nd) by making a monetary donation in thankfulness to God for His many blessings. Please make checks out to Faith Lutheran Church, and note at the bottom "Thankoffering," or place them in the special envelope you were provided and return them on Sunday, October 22nd. These offerings will be sent to Lutheran World Relief to support their Quilt and Shipping fund. According to the Lutheran World Relief website, it costs \$2.25 per quilt, \$2.65 per personal care kit and \$1.40 per school kit to ship these items to their final destinations where needed throughout the world. Faith Lutheran will be sending about 230 or more quilts, 180 school kits, and 77 personal care kits the first week of November.

Thanks to all who donated supplies and/or money for these quilts and kits. All quilts were made from donations of materials of all kinds, old sheets, blankets, bedspreads, sewing thread, and crochet thread. Donations may be left at the church or call Margit Thurston at 830-305-0035. Helping hands are always welcome! The ladies meet 9 a.m. – noon on Wednesdays.
