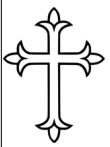

## From the Desk of Pastor Dan

### Pastor's Perspective: September

Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers, rooted in the late nineteenth century labor movement to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity and wellbeing.

For many of us, Labor Day is the unofficial end of summer, as the popular 60's song goes, See You in September. It's when we get back into our routines, kids go back to school, and (hopefully) the weather begins to cool. Labor Day is a secular, national holiday, yet that doesn't mean the church doesn't have anything to contribute to the celebration.

Dr. Gene Veith, in an his article "Masks of God," writes: When I go into a restaurant, the waitress who brings me my meal, the cook in the back who prepared it, the delivery men, the wholesalers, the workers in the food-processing factories, the butchers, the farmers, ranchers, and everyone else in the economic food chain are all being used by God to "give me this day my daily bread." This is the doctrine of vocation. God works through people, in their ordinary stations of life to which He has called them, to care for His creation. In this way, He cares for everyone whom He has given life. Luther puts it more strongly: Vocations are "masks of God." On the surface, we see an ordinary human face - our mother, doctor, teacher, waitress, pastor - but, beneath the appearances, God is ministering to us through them. God is hidden in human vocations.

The workers we recognize and celebrate are the masks of God, actively working through them, for your good. God has placed them in their respective roles, given them their talents, gifts and skills so that we would have food, health care, energy, transportation, education, entertainment and more.

It is also true that God is also working through YOU for the benefit of your neighbor. You are a mask of God to love and serve others who in need. Whenever we fulfill our God given vocations - worker, employer, parent, spouse, grandparent, etc. - we are "masks of God" for our neighbor's good. Paraphrasing Luther, "God does not need our good works. But our neighbor does."

As you celebrate Labor Day by visiting family, camping, fishing, BBQing or just relaxing, thank God for all the workers through whom He works to provide for all your needs and strive to fulfill your various vocations by which YOU are God's mask to serve your neighbor.

## Paraments and the Seasons and Festivals of the Church- *Part 4*

The church's season of green continues in September with the green with grapes paraments, having replaced the summer green paraments. On Sunday, October 27, Lutherans and other Protestants celebrate Reformation, honoring Martin Luther's posting of his 95 Theses on the Castle Church doors in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517. Paraments change to red for this celebration and special pieces identify this day, ie. the Luther rose on the pulpit parament. It is a day to focus on the principles of the Reformation, such as justification by faith alone and the authority of Scripture.

On the next Sunday, paraments change to white for All Saints Sunday, November 3, as we remember those who have passed into eternal life.

The last few Sundays of Pentecost follow with the green with grapes paraments until the last Sunday of the church year. That Sunday is Christ the King Sunday when white paraments are again used.

Paraments will change to blue for the next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, also the first Sunday of the church year.

## Too Busy NOT to Pray

I don't know about you, but I am tired. I'm not the kind of tired that can be managed by an extra hour or two of sleep. Rather I am talking about the rhythms of a full and busy life where there are simply not enough hours in the day, days in the week, or weeks in the month to get everything done. The day-to-day activities of life, even life in ministry, can result in a weariness that can steal our joy of living the life that we are so busy living that we really aren't actually living! Have you ever felt this way?

As I think about my weariness and the endless "To Do" lists, I recall a conversation I had with my mom 20 years ago. She had called me just to chat and I didn't really have the time. I told her I was busy, and she asked what I had going on that day. I rattled off all the things I had to get done and she replied: "Oh, my! You are busy. It sounds like you probably need to pray." I was frustrated with her: "Mom, I don't have time to pray!" As soon as I said it, I realized how foolish I was. My mother answered, "Bryce, listen to yourself. You're a pastor! You are too busy NOT to pray!"

As was often the case, my mom was right. No matter how busy I am or how much is on my calendar, my "To Do" list pales in comparison to Jesus': there were always more sick people to heal, more demons to cast out, more sins to forgive, more disciples to teach, and more towns to visit. Remarkably, Jesus never seemed to be in a hurry and yet made an impact everywhere he went.

In Luke 5:14-15, we read this about Jesus: But the news about him spread even more, and large crowds would come together to hear him and to be healed of their sicknesses. Yet he often withdrew to deserted places and prayed. No matter what demands of ministry Jesus faced, he regularly retreated for quiet time with his Father in heaven. Do I really think I don't need this in my life?

Once again, I must come to terms with the ways that I fall short of what I think I should be as a follower of Jesus, as a husband and a father, and as a pastor. In the busyness of my life, I need to remember that I am too busy not to pray. I long to live an unhurried and yet impactful life like Jesus did. And that means I need to regularly withdraw for prayer and fellowship with God. Whenever I do, God restores my soul and fills me up to continue to carryout the work he created me for. I invite you to join me in this and expect that we will be amazed at all the Lord accomplishes in us and through us.
