## **Pastor's Point: Lent** *by Pastor Dan*



The Book of Joel is an exciting and a short read, ONLY 3 CHAPTERS! Joel viewed a locust plague that ravished the country as God's judgment on the people. Joel called them to repentance. Using the catastrophe as a dire warning, Joel goes on to depict the coming Day of the Lord and its final judgments and blessings. Joel was a prophet who exercised his ministry within the priestly circles. From Joel we can read what has become a main text for the season of Lent:

*Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. (Joel 2:12-13)*

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5, this year, and ends in Holy Week. More frequent worship opportunities, daily Lenten disciplines, the drama of the Maundy Thursday celebration of the Last Supper, the Good Friday Tenebrae/Service of Shadows and the joy of Easter sunrise all make for a busy and productive time in the life of a congregation. With the coming of spring, the "springing ahead of the clocks" (this year early Sunday morning, March 9) and the growing daylight thrown in, it makes for a special time in the church year.

Faith's congregational focus on Jesus' life and passion is sharpened during Lent. It is a time for people to rediscover and reflect on the great salvation story of God's love for us in Christ, the Lord. So many in the world seem to have turned away from the faith. The daily news seems divisive and depressing. The people of the world need God desperately. All of us need of some "re-centering."

Let our re-centering begin:

Use a daily Lenten devotional book...Change something in your life that will be a challenge for you to accomplish. It takes time and repetition for a new habit to form...Encourage someone to grow in their faith. Giving the gift of faith to someone is priceless. Who could you encourage...Come to Wednesday night Lenten suppers at 6pm in the LEC, then gather for midweek Lenten worship in the sanctuary at 7pm. Together, we will reflect on "Jesus: Our Savior, Servant, Friend."

Make time for God. God always has time for you. Together, may we deepen our faith in the One who came to save us!

Rolf and Beate Sieker started their professional music career in Berlin, Germany. They played many concerts in Germany, toured throughout the European countries, appeared on tv and radio shows and recorded five albums, two in Nashville and three in Berlin. In 1997 they moved to Nashville, TN and since the year 2000, they live near Austin, TX, live music capital of the world.

**Rolf Sieker** was one of the first 5-string banjo players in Europe. In 1975 he recorded the very first bluegrass album in Germany. In Europe Rolf played with Bill Monroe, Byron Berline, Bill Clifton and many more. He recorded studio sessions with Ray Benson & Asleep At The Wheel, Kelly Willis, Dale Watson, Red Volkaert, Trace Atkins, and many others. Now living in the US he won the Texas State Banjo Championship in 2001.

This past month I had the privilege of hosting our fifth Harvest Workers Retreat. Ranging in age from 20-something to 70-something, a total of 24 ministry students, faculty, staff, and spouses came together from across Texas and around the country for three days of rest, instruction, worship, prayer, fellowship, and encouragement. While each retreat has been a delight in its own way, this year's retreat was extra special for me personally. I came away from this retreat overwhelmed with gratitude to God for the immense blessing it was—not only for me, but for so many of our students as well.

As I reflected on this fantastic weekend, I wondered what made this retreat so special. What was it that caused my heart to rejoice and feel so full of joy and thanksgiving? As I reflected, the lyrics of the song “Change My Heart, O God” by Eddie Espinosa flooded my mind: Change my heart, O God; Make it ever true; Change my heart, O God; May I be like you; You are the potter; I am the clay; Mold me and make me; This is what I pray; Change my heart, O God; Make it ever true; Change my heart, O God; May I be like you.

This beautiful song of repentance is born out of the words of Isaiah 64:8, Yet Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we all are the work of your hands. In this verse, we are reminded of the truth about our formation: that God desires to continue to mold, shape, and refine us throughout our lives. As long as we have breath in our lungs, God is not done with us!

What made this year's retreat remarkable was how the participants seemed to be so incredibly humble, moldable, malleable, and teachable. God prepared the hearts and minds of those who gathered in his Spirit to receive all that he intended to give. It reminded me of the importance of our posture before the Lord: What kind of clay are we? Are we dry, hardened, and set in our ways? Or are we moist, malleable, and eager to be shaped in the hands of the master potter?

So, I give thanks to God anew for the blessings of Harvest Workers students across our association of churches: women and men of every age and stage who are eager to learn and grow, to continue to be molded and shaped by our Lord in order to serve him in different and new ways as he leads and calls. And through these students, the Lord reminds me personally that he also continues to call me (and you, too) to learn, grow, and be formed by him.

This year as we enter the season of Lent, I pray that each of us can offer ourselves in a spirit of humility before our Lord. I invite you to adopt the prayer of the song “Change My Heart, O God”, repenting with an eagerness to be formed in the Potter's hands.
