From the Pastor's Desk

12 ¹*I lift up my eyes to the hills.
From where does my help come?*
²*My help comes from the Lord,

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I am writing this after spending an incredible week in Guatemala with Moving Mountains.

From the roof of the place we were staying in Antigua, we could see Volcan De Agua. Up in those hills, we served the community of Santa de Maria de Jesus.

As I marveled at this volcanic mountain, I drew myself to Psalm 121 and its prayer, "I lift my eyes to the hills, where does my help come from." Then, the Psalmist responds in confidence, "My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

While serving in the Santa de Maria de Jesus, I saw that while many were materially impoverished, they were spiritually full. They had faith that God would watch over them and give them their daily bread—through us, or through others. I came away from this trip deeply touched.

Such memory became an inspiration for me as we now look forward to our 60th anniversary. While much in this world demands our attention, our help "comes from our Lord." While we struggle about the unknown in front of us, we know that God, who does not slumber, has watched over Faith for the past 60 years, and will continue to watch over you and me "from this time forth forevermore."

Therefore, as we embark on our 60th anniversary and as we start another school year, know that the same Lord "who made heave and earth" will be us "forevermore."

SCHOOL SUPPLY TIME FOR LWR KITS

With back-to-school season underway, store shelves are stocked and school supply sales are in full swing. This is a wonderful opportunity to support the Women of Faith in assembling Lutheran World Relief (LWR) School Kits for children in need around the world.

Thanks to the generosity of Faith's members, Charity Circle shipped 252 school kits to Lutheran World Relief in November 2025. Your contributions of school supplies and financial support made this possible, and we are grateful for your continued partnership in this important ministry.

Many of our supplies will be purchased in bulk through Amazon. However, one item that is currently more affordable in local stores is the 70-sheet spiral notebook (wide- or college-ruled). At present, Walmart and H-E-B have these notebooks available for approximately 35 cents each. (Please note: loose notebook paper cannot be included in the kits.)

If you would like to contribute supplies, we are currently collecting:

COUNCIL CORNER

August is harvest time in Texas. Thanks to recent rains, folks are cutting hay and harvesting corn. Even with the recent flooding, the rain has been a gift—one of those reminders that God provides what the land needs in His timing, not ours. The parables we've heard over the past few Sundays have echoed that truth: seed falling on different kinds of soil, and grain growing even while weeds try to crowd it out. Growth takes patience, tending, and trust. Ministry works the same way.

That steady, faithful work continues for Council. Our Constitution and Bylaws updates are nearing completion, and we expect to present the full proposed revisions to the congregation in September. These documents shape how we function as a church, and ensuring clarity and alignment in them remains one of our most important responsibilities. Facility improvements are moving forward as well. Exterior trim repairs and painting are underway, helping us care well for the campus entrusted to us. We are still exploring options for bathroom upgrades and other improvements. We also are keeping our financial house in order and are moving forward with an external audit (no concerns, but ensuring good stewardship and transparency).

And of course, the excitement around our 60th Anniversary celebration keeps building. This milestone is more than a date on the calendar; it is a celebration of God's faithfulness across six decades of ministry, worship, service, and community. Make sure you get your anniversary T-shirt, get involved, and save the date.

As we move into August and thinking back to planting in a drought in March, I'm reminded of Jesus' words in Mark 4:26-27: "A man scatters seed on the ground... and the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how." God is at work—quietly, faithfully, and powerfully—in the fields around us and in the ministry we share. There are no doldrums of summer here. This is a season of tending, growing, and preparing for the harvest God is bringing.

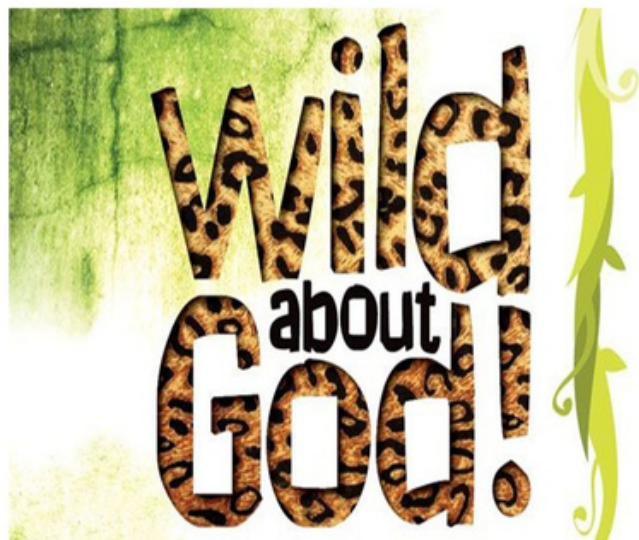

A New Season of Learning

As we prepare to flip the calendar to August, there is no denying it's back-to-school time! Stores are showcasing all the school supplies front and center. Moms and Dads are taking their kids shopping for new clothes and shoes and backpacks and a never-ending list of things that every parent hopes will help their son or daughter learn and grow in the new school year. Soon churches will be blessing backpacks, praying for schools, and teachers, as the buses begin to roll. For many, the end of summer is a reminder of fresh starts and new learning. What if this became a life-prompt for our discipleship journey? As I write this, we will soon be gathering in New Braunfels around the theme CALLED. Together we are exploring 2 Timothy 1:9 and are reminded that God saves us and calls us with a holy calling, not because of anything we have earned or accomplished, but according to his own purpose and grace. That is where the Christian life begins. Yet Paul does not leave Timothy, or us, there. In 2 Timothy 2:2 he instructs young Timothy what those who are called are to do next: What you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, commit to faithful men who will be able to teach others also.

Notice the sequence Paul describes here: He taught Timothy. Timothy is then to entrust that same teaching to other faithful people. Then those faithful people are in turn to teach others. That is four generations of discipleship referenced in a single verse! This is how the gospel moves through history: from one disciple to another, passed down from one generation to the next. Every follower of Jesus is simultaneously a learner and a trainer: We never graduate from Jesus' discipleship training, always both learning from those who are ahead of us and teaching those who are coming after us. With that in mind, let me ask you two questions to ponder:

First, how is God calling you to keep on learning? Perhaps you join a small group or Bible study, or ask another believer to meet with and mentor you for a while. The One who called you longs to keep forming you by His grace and for His purpose. So how is God calling you to continue to grow and mature in your faith life in this new season? Second, whom will you teach? You do not need a theology degree to be faithful to the call in 2 Timothy 2:2. You need only to faithfully pass on what you yourself have received. Teach a child, mentor a new believer, or open your home and your Bible to a neighbor. Invest in someone who will receive the Word of truth from you in the hope that in the same way one day they may invest in another.

This is the very heart of our shared mission as a District: to multiply disciples and churches. Through intentional relationships we seek to equip leaders, strengthen congregations, and inspire gospel mission. When we gather each year in July, it is never our finish line. Rather this is the starting line for a new season of learning and growth in faith. I pray that we may be hungry and eager learners and diligent, humble and faithful teachers, so that the good news we have received keeps on multiplying and being handed down from one generation to the next.
